

TERMS and CONDITIONS for MEMBERSHIP OF COLLEGE

1. The members of the College shall comprise the present members and such other persons as are admitted to membership of the College in accordance with this Constitution.
2. Membership of the College shall be divided into the following classes of members namely:
 - (a) fellows;
 - (b) honorary fellows and
 - (c) associate members
3. The rights and privileges of each member shall be personal to himself/herself and shall not be transferable by his/her own act or by the operation of law.
4. Without prejudice to the provision in the Constitution relating to honorary fellows no member shall be entitled to exercise the rights and privileges of a member unless all moneys due and payable by him/her to the College or any branch shall have been paid.
5. An associate member of the College shall not be entitled to vote and shall not be eligible for election to the Council.
6. A member shall cease to be a member if:
 - (a) he/she becomes a person whose personal property is liable to be dealt with in any way under the Law relating to mental health;
 - (b) he/she fails for a period of not less than six months after an account thereof has been sent to him/her to pay any monies due by him/her to the College or any branch and the Council determines that he/she should by reason thereof cease to be a member;
 - (c) he/she is expelled from the College in the manner provided in the Constitution;
 - (d) he/she resigns after giving written notice thereof to the College.
7. Any person who ceases to be a member of the College shall nevertheless remain liable to pay to the College all monies, which at the time of his/her ceasing to be a member may be due by him/her to the College.
8. Any person who ceases to be a member of the College shall thereupon forfeit all the rights and privileges which members enjoy and shall have no right in or claim upon the College or the property of the College arising out of his/her past membership.
9. Any person whose membership has ceased may upon application be re-admitted to membership by the Council providing the circumstances resulting in the cessation of membership have changed.
10. The provisions of this Constitution relating to application for and admission to membership of the College shall apply to any application for re-admission by any such person.
